The Red Cross In Your Community

Disaster Relief and Community Disaster Education

When a disaster threatens or strikes, your Red Cross is there. This year we responded to **67 local disasters**, including 53 residential fires. We helped **1,537 people** with emergency food, shelter and supplies – more than 500 of these were children.

Local disasters can affect a single home or many thousands of people. This year your Red Cross provided relief to our neighbors at the 130-unit Castle West Apartments fire, the Holly Tornado, and provided more than **7,000 meals** and opened **24 shelters** in response to four blizzards.

Because being prepared can make your family and community safer and sometimes minimize injury and destruction, we presented disaster education information to nearly **6,000 households**.

Health and Safety Services

From first aid, CPR and AED training to Babysitter's Training, swimming and lifeguarding, American Red Cross programs help people lead safer and healthier lives. This year, **19,460 individuals** learned lifesaving skills through Red Cross classes.

International Services

The international tracing program helps local families find relatives with whom they have lost contact because of a natural disaster, war, or internal conflict. This year, the Pikes Peak Chapter helped reconnect **two families** with loved ones in foreign lands.

Service to the Armed Forces

The American Red Cross provides communication between those in the Armed Forces and their families. We have a worldwide network that reaches service members wherever they are to communicate a birth, death or illness. This year we provided emergency connections for **869 military families**. To make sure these services are known to our military families, we provided outreach to more than 11,440 service members and family members.

A Note about Volunteers

We depend on volunteers of all ages and backgrounds to carry on our work. Volunteers constitute **97 percent of our total workforce**, serving as members of the board, instructors teaching lifesaving skills, disaster action team members, office administrators, event organizers and more.

This year, over **300 volunteers** made the work of the chapter possible, contributing more than **10,300 hours**, for a contribution estimated at \$150,000.
